
(The March 2023 Rally in Perry will be the 13th time in Perry.)

EASTERN SHARPS AND FLATS FMCA Frustrated Maestros 2022 Annual Meeting

The annual business meeting of the Eastern Sharps and Flats Frustrated Maestro Chapter of FMCA was held on Tuesday, July 12, 2022, in the Blue Ribbon Bldg at the WV State Fairgrounds, Lewisburg, West Virginia during the Greater Eastern Area Region rally.

Vice President, Bruce Taylor, called the meeting to order at 4:33 PM in the absence of President Bud Gallagher. Bruce Taylor appointed Kathy Fuller as Acting Secretary in the absence of Secretary-Treasurer, Pat Murton.

Members in attendance signed a Meeting Attendance Roster. A quorum was present. The invocation was given by Carl Turner. Ira Miller led the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.

A motion to accept the minutes of the 2019 meeting, which were emailed to all members in April of 2022 was made by MaryAnn Miller and seconded by Nick Hefner. The motion passed.

The Financial Report as of June 30, 2022 was also emailed to all members. Nick Hefner made the motion to accept the report. It passed.

The National Director Report was summarized by Bruce Taylor in the place of Bill Murton. A detailed report had been sent out by Bill shortly after the convention in Gillette, Wyoming, July 7-10, 2021.

The Music Director Report was given by Charles Marston. He complemented the musicians and told them they are worthy of many superlatives and ended with, "you all are simply the best." Bruce Taylor presented a gift to Charles and Roxie for their dedication to the Maestros.

The Nominating Committee report was given by Cliff Freed and Bruce Taylor, in the absence of Bill Murton, Committee Chair. The committee's recommendations were:

The floor was open for further nominations and none were given. The motion to accept the slate was made by Nick Hefner and seconded by Ira Miller. The motion passed.

The Nominating committee for the next year for a one-year term will be Nick Hefner, Dale Averill and Rosemarie Ladue.

There was a motion to hold a Music Camp in the Fall of 2023 just before GEAR at the West Virginia State Fairgrounds in Lewisburg, WV. The motion was made by Nick Hefner and seconded by Dale Averill. The motion passed. The date will be determined when GEAR dates for 2023 are set. There was a discussion about having a variety of music at the camp and providing music for the enjoyment of the musicians as well as for the program.

A motion was made by Bruce Taylor to give new members the opportunity to come in at this meeting and be considered paid through 2023 as well. The motion was seconded by Paul Monat and passed by the group.

July 12, 2022 Minutes Continued

A written motion from Pat Murton was submitted to purchase a Memorial Brick to be placed in the FMCA campground. The \$50 purchase price would be taken from the treasury. Nick Hefner seconded the motion which was then passed.

Meredith Walker reported that she was the only one at her chapter meeting.

Committee appointments were made for the year:

The Music Camp committee is Nick Heffner, Cliff Freed, and Phil Fuller. Meredith Walker is a potential member and would respond back later as to her status.

Bruce Taylor made a motion to adjourn and the meeting was closed.
